These persons appeared recently in the Williams County Common Pleas Court:

Brandon L. Seigel, 21, Edwardsburg, Michigan pleaded guilty to Robbery, a felony of the second degree. Sentencing is scheduled for July 7, 2008 at 9:00 a.m. The charge stems from the attempted robbery at the Blakeslee branch of the Edon State Bank on April 14, 2008.

Michael P. Robinson, 29, Stryker, Ohio was sentenced on Breaking and Entering, a felony of the fifth degree, Receiving Stolen Property, a felony of the fifth degree, and Possessing Criminal Tools, a felony of the fifth degree to a total term of incarceration of thirty (30) months to be served at the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction.

Paul D. Neal, 53, Edgerton, Ohio pleaded guilty to Trafficking in Marihuana, a felony of the fifth degree. Sentencing is scheduled for July 7, 2008 at 9:15 a.m.

Jacquelyn D. Prater, 47, Bryan, Ohio pleaded guilty to Theft, a felony of the fourth degree. Sentencing is scheduled for July 14, 2008 at 9:15 a.m.

Erin M. Fuller, 22, Bryan, Ohio was sentenced on three counts of Trafficking in Marihuana, all felonies of the fifth degree, to a total term of incarceration of ten (10) months to be served at the Ohio Department of

Rehabilitation and Correction.

Jade W. Herzog, 32, Defiance, Ohio was sentenced on the charge of Non-Support of Dependents, a felony of the fifth degree, to three (3) years of community control.

Brandon S. John, 19, West Unity, Ohio was sentenced on the charge of Attempted Burglary, a third degree felony, to three (3) years of community control.

Pascal T. Mapati, 29, Edgerton, Ohio was sentenced on the charge of Burglary, a felony of the fourth degree, to three (3) years of community control.
