### **September 3, 2009 NEWS RELEASE**

These persons appeared recently in the Williams County Common Pleas Court:

James W. Mills, 43, of Butler, Indiana, was convicted following a two day jury trial of four (4) counts of Illegal Assembly or Possession of Chemicals for the Manufacture of Drugs (Methamphetamine), all felonies of the third degree, and one (1) count of Attempted Illegal Assembly or Possession of Chemicals for the Manufacture of Drugs (Methamphetamine), a felony of the fourth degree. He was then sentenced to a total term of incarceration of eight (8) years and six (6) months to be served at the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction.

Joseph D. Goebel, 21, of Edgerton, Ohio, pleaded guilty to the charge of Illegal Manufacture of Drugs (Methamphetamine), a felony of the second degree. He was then sentenced to three (3) years to be served at the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction.

Jason A. Dufresne, 26, of Bryan Ohio, was sentenced to the charge of Attempted Failure to Notify Change of Address, a felony of the fourth degree to two (2) years of community control.

Joshua I. Dunning, 34, of Bryan, Ohio, pleaded guilty to the charge of Domestic Violence, a felony of the fourth degree. Sentencing is scheduled for October 8, 2009 at 2:30 p.m.

Donald E. Pierce, 26, of Fayette, Ohio, was sentenced on the charge of Passing Bad Checks, a felony of the fifth degree to eleven (11) months, to be served at the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction.

Shawn C. McCullough, 33, of Alvordton, Ohio, was sentenced on the charge of Domestic Violence, a felony of the fourth degree to two (2) years of community control, which shall be served as monitored time.
